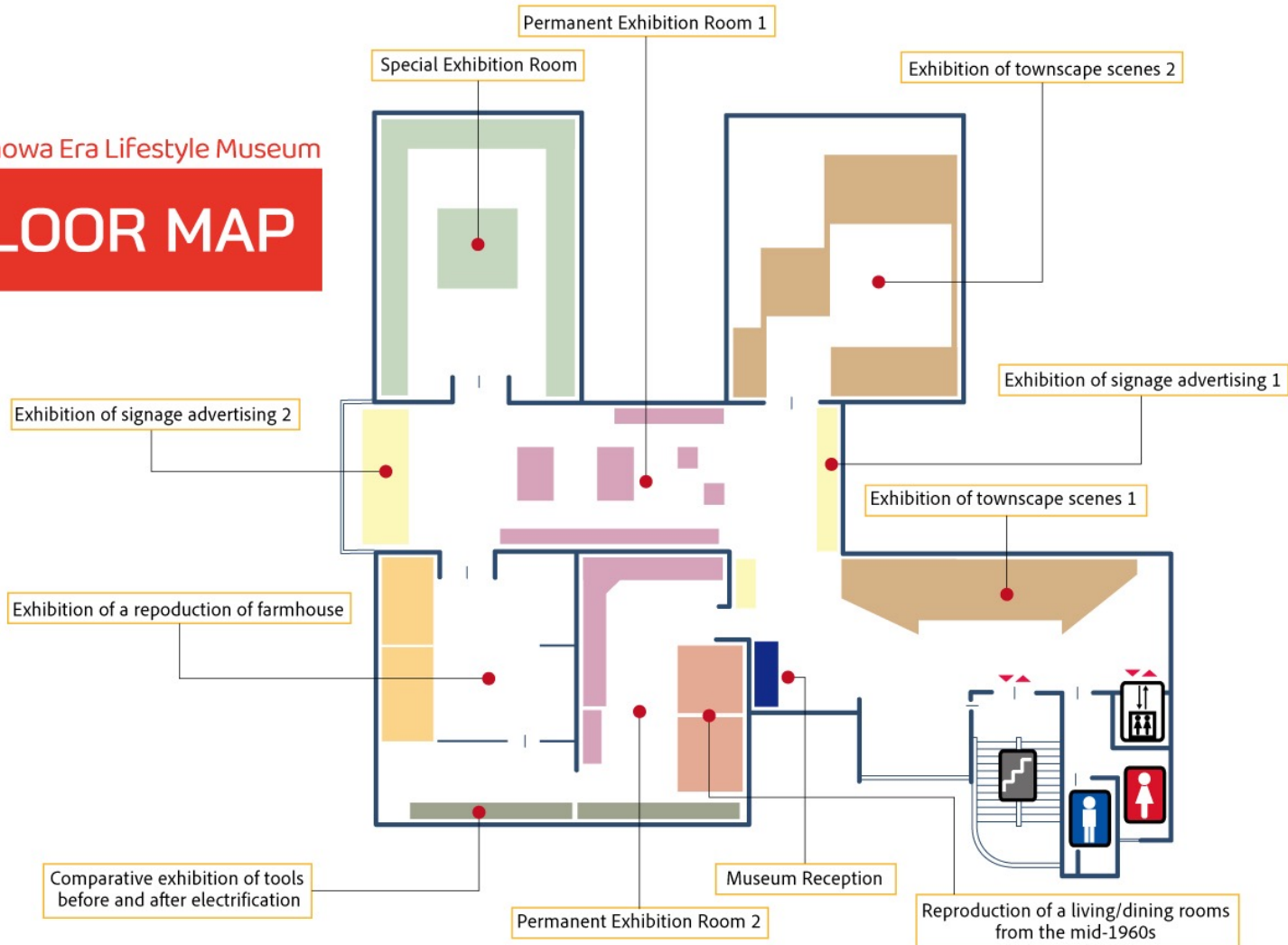

Tools used in past lifestyle are categorized and displayed according to scenes of daily life.



Exhibition of a reproduction of farmhouse

Reproduction of traditional farmhouse architecture of the region before 1950s.
Old style kitchen with KAMADO (a clay oven) set in earthen floors.



Comparative exhibition of tools before and after electrification

Comparative displays of the tools of daily life before and after electrification. The widespread use of electrical appliances has changed domestic labors, such as cooking and washing.

Tools used in past lifestyle are categorized and displayed according to scenes of daily life.



Reproduction of a living / dining rooms from the mid-1960s

In the 1960s, there was a significant increase in the availability of televisions and other electrical appliances in homes.

This was accompanied by a rise in the popularity of Western lifestyles, such as eating meals in a seated position at dining table.
